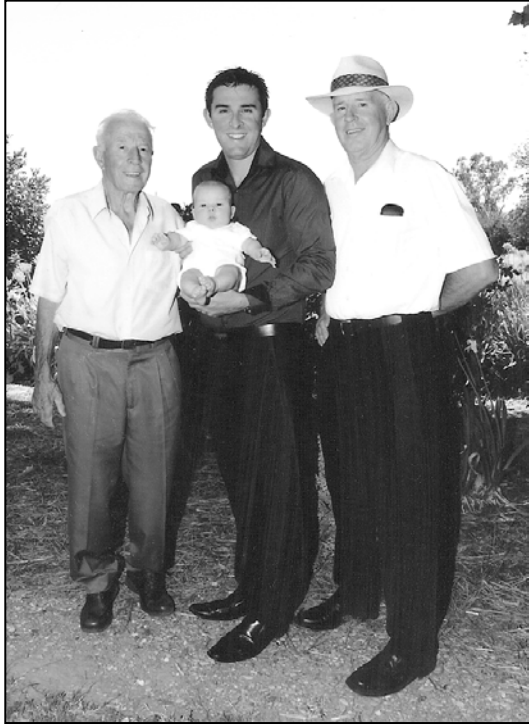

A guest chef will be cooking up a Thai treat at the Whorouly Hotel this Saturday evening, 8th March.
