As well as all the post office facilities, there will be a small range of grocery supplies (eg milk, bread, sugar, eggs) on offer, as well as all the usual newspapers and magazines.

And, most excitingly, Whorouly will once again have a seven-day-a-week café.

Whorouly Café (not very flamboyant, but apt) will be offering coffee, tea, milkshakes, cold drinks, ice-creams, lollies, cakes, slices, sandwiches, pies, hot chips and light meals from 8am to 5pm.

Once we find our feet, we will probably expand the offerings and may adjust the opening hours, but we have to start somewhere.

Please be understanding during the transition phase – we will do our best, but we are likely to have a few hiccups.
